« Thinking Immigration and Integration Differently » A Belgian inter-university initiative

Why this initiative?

The issue of migrations raises serious questions and debates at both the political and civil society levels in Belgium. Since September 11th, those debates turned into more passionate ones (Abu Jahjah, the Islamic veil, foreigners' voting rights, the overuse of the migratory theme in political discourse sometimes bordering xenophobia, etc.).

The existing studies on the subject regularly suffer from a lack of media coverage and the scientific recommendations are not often translated into effective public policies, as shown by the debate of ethnic employment discrimination. In the multitude of studies and a sometime alarmist media coverage, the people does not always realize the real successes that are in fact achieved through public measures or positive integration experiences.

This conference's objective is to show the current state of immigration and integration problematic by presenting a qualitative assessment of the most recent research. Not wanting to fall in the trap of easy hostile discourses charged with stereotypes that consider the immigrants and their family a source of menace, this conference hopes to contribute in the acknowledgement of the positive influence of immigration in Belgium.

The Project

From this assessment, an idea emerged in numerous Belgian universities to promote a great initiative called "Belgian inter-university initiative on Immigration and Integration" with the quadruple objective of:

- promote the existing scientific prodution and valorize it by a) broadcasting the information by all means and possible techniques;
- Finance new policy oriented researchs on crucial themes b)
- Bring some light on the topic without masking the real issues, and c) show the positive experiences of integration at the local, regional and national levels in various areas such as the educational, the economical, the municipal, and the neigbourhood spheres.

- 1. It is a Belgian initiative, in the sense that it will be require the participation of the major universities and research institutions specialized in the migratory theme.
- 2. It is an initiative that want to point out its inter-university aspect in its conception and realization.
- 3. It is an initiative willing to involve actors from the civil society and the associative world, as well as all the organizations whose activities promote a better sensibilization, a better integration and non-discrimination policy such as: the King Baudoin Foundation, the Queen Paola Foundation, the MEDEA, and the Centre pour l'Egalité des Chances.

A two Steps project:

- 1. An important **conference** including an inaugural session and five thematic sessions on October 18th and 19th 2004.
- 2. A **financing effort for research project** including the best experts on migratory questions (Flanders and Wallonia-Brussels), whose invitation to tender will be made public in the first half of 2004, and whose predicted start will be October 2004.
